## 95. PUBLIC AID

## We support:

- 1. Public aid based on individual needs, but will not support public aid programs so lucrative that there is an economic advantage in becoming a recipient.
- 2. Greater uniformity in residency requirements and relative levels of payment among the states in all categories of public aid.
- 3. More careful supervision of welfare payments at the local level.
- 4. Use of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) funds for only those foods that are dietetically wholesome and nutritious and shall not be limited to locally-grown or organic production.
- 5. Legislation requiring able-bodied recipients to work in order to be eligible for receipt of public aid. Such work could include work on public or civic projects.
- 6. Shifting responsibility of public aid programs from the federal to the state government through the use of block grants.
- 7. The requirement of photo IDs on all LINK cards issued through the State of Illinois that must be presented at the time of purchase.
- 8. Efforts to increase Regional Food Banks' proportion of state and federal public aid funds for food and nutrition assistance programs.
- 9. Limiting what items can be purchased using Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds. Items such as alcohol, cigarettes, lotto tickets, and similar items should be excluded.
